

HOA Compliance Tips

The Villas of Sunset Grove is a deed-restricted community. We've listed the top 6 non-compliance issues we see on a regular basis. If you park at night, do it right.

Vehicles cannot be parked on Sunset Grove Lane during the hours of 12am-7am and will be towed if they are. **TIP:** Use the overflow parking space in the East or West end of the community to park your car. There's plenty of space there!



Give your car some swagger, park it in a stagger.

For the safety of all our residents, vehicles must be parked on the street in a staggered formation. **TIP:** Think of it as a zipper. If a vehicle is parked on one side of the street, park yours in front of or behind theirs, but on the *other* side of the street.



Overgrown greenery is not approved scenery.

When trees, weeds, vines and plants start growing over your fence or wall, it is the homeowner's responsibility to trim them back. **TIP:** Maintain a regular trimming schedule to ensure greenery doesn't get out of control on your side of the fence/wall.



If it's your pet, don't forget ...

We love our fur babies! Please clean their mess (no one likes stepping in poop) and keep dogs on a leash so they don't roam into a neighbor's yard. **TIP:** Carry plastic bags with you on dog walks and leave a leash right by your door so you never forget it.



Trash bins off the street keeps our neighborhood nice and neat.

No bins at the curb more than 24 hours before or after the scheduled Tuesday pick-up day. **TIP:** Going away? Ask a neighbor to take care of your bins for you, and then return the favor for them or another neighbor when they need it.



Keep your lawn healthy and green with a steady mowing routine. Your grass should always be 6 inches high or less. During the rainy season, this means a lot of mowing. **TIP:** Share the responsibility with a neighbor by taking turns mowing your neighboring lawns. Also, contact your landscaper if you're going away.



Commercial vehicles are a no-no; make sure your signs don't show. Advertising signs, political signs and commercial signs on vehicles can't be displayed anywhere on the property. **TIP:** If you have a special concern, reach out to the HOA board of directors for guidance and help.



Keep carport clutter concealed, especially for better curb appeal. Everyone loves a clean, beautiful home exterior. A big part of this is keeping your carport and driveway free of clutter. **TIP:** Out of storage space? Purge your storage several times a year and get rid of anything you don't need.



Avoid HOA violation fees—no vehicles on your lawn, please.

Parking on the lawn kills the beautiful grass that our community homes enjoy. It also makes the neighborhood look unsightly. **TIP:** Have guests park in the East and West overflow areas or ask a neighbor if you can use their driveway from time to time.



Special holiday lights are OK, but then they need to be put away.

Holiday lights are festive and fun. But when the holidays are over, we need to keep a consistent look in our community. **TIP:** When taking down your holiday lights, move them to your back yard if you want to enjoy them a little longer.
